PURPOSE

The AA with Emphasis in Social Justice prepares students to articulate conceptions of social justice across multiple perspectives, understand forms of oppression, and develop skills and knowledge to become effective social change agents. The A.A. with Emphasis prepares students for transfer to a four-year degree to pursue a wide variety of majors, such as anthropology, communication studies, gender and women’s studies, ethnic studies, social justice, public policy, political science, sociology, criminal justice, and pre-law.
