  - \*Lower division general education courses can be taken earlier, but not later than the identified semester; Upper division general education courses may be taken in a flexible option (see flexible option plan).
  - \*\*Traditional students take NURS 2700, Mobility students take NURS 2720 (Mobility track available to students who hold an unencumbered LP license)
  - Credits in AD Degree: 35 Nursing; 40 prerequisites= 75 total
  - Credits after licensure eligibility to BSN: 30 Nursing; 15 general education credits (10 general education credits must be upper division; 5 credits may be taken at lower division level and transferred (ex: Statistics).
